VOTING PROTOCOL

There seemed to be confusion about voting privileges among some members at the February election.

Per our Bylaws, Article II - Meetings and Voting:

Section 5. Voting. Each member of a voting class of membership in good standing whose dues are paid for in the current year shall be entitled to one vote at any meeting of the Club at which he/she is present.

Proxy voting will not be permitted at any Club meeting or election.

For purposes of a quorum and those provisions requiring action by a percentage of the membership in good standing, only the number of members of a voting class of membership shall be counted.

THANK YOU TO QCDTC

I want to assure everyone in the club that all the information I've amassed on maintenance, our vendors, cleaning products, supplies, and major maintenance projects is documented in an extensive Maintenance Handbook to ensure this valuable information is readily available to the Board.

I want to thank all those who have contributed their time and efforts to make this club so special. There are too many to name, but I'd like to recognize three in particular:

 Beth Janos, who organized so many world-class training seminars. The week-long Susan Garrett seminar in 2010 was life-changing, and ranks just behind finding QCDTC in 1987 for me.

- · Catherine Berberich, whose efficient but Herculean efforts as treasurer are amazing. You try handling all the deposits, bills, trial refunds, judges payments, and vendors' bills for a club of roughly 500 that puts on as many classes and events as we do (and coming to the events to pay judges, or arranging for another officer to do so)... all while managing your own business with very challenging tax seasons. You have no idea what she has given up to serve this club, or the daily toll that it takes. Catherine is also often the first person to identify concerns with building maintenance—flagging the water leak issue through increasingly high water bills. She proactively analyzes our income and expenses, identifying trends or issues that may need further attention.







LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The Ohio Legislature has regrouped for the 136th legislative session (2025-2026) and a lawmaker has introduced a bill to upgrade the state's companion animal abuse statute.

Senate Bill 64 increases penalties for misdemeanor and felony convictions of Ohio's animal cruelty law by raising some misdemeanors to felonies and making maximum prison sentences mandatory depending on the severity of the offense as described in Ohio Revised Code Section 959.01. The bill also prohibits ownership of a companion animal or residence in a home with a companion animal for three years following release from incarceration or completion of other penalties imposed by the court.

Introduced by Senator Al Cutrona of Canfield, SB 64 was assigned to the Senate Judiciary Committee and had its sponsor testimony on February 19. Text of the bill as introduced is at https://tinyurl.com/4m6jbdtj.

Other state initiatives to watch

Things that pop up in one state often make the rounds of other state and local jurisdictions. AKC is watching efforts such as the defeated New Hampshire bill to ban breeds with certain physical features it labels as cruel and now has an eye on a New Jersey proposal to license dog trainers and establish a one-size-fits-all statewide dog training regimen. From the AKC alert: "SB 3814 seeks to provide oversight to dog trainers. As used in the legislation, dog training means the handling or training of dogs for a fee, salary, or other form of compensation. Specifically, the bill establishes the Dog Training Licensing Board and provides authorization for the board to, among other items: 1) develop educational and experiential requirements for licensure as a dog trainer; and 2) adopt rules and regulations regarding dog training."

A law similar to the thwarted New Hampshire bill has been approved in Ojai, California, laying groundwork for further expansion in other jurisdictions. The initial alert on the New Jersey trainer licensing bill is on the AKC Government Relations site at https://tinyurl.com/yfcs3a5a; the initial hearing was set for February 10 but massive opposition led the sponsor to hold it back. AKC will continue to monitor the bill.

FDA tells veterinarians about adverse event reports for Librela

The US Food and Drug Administration's Center for Veterinary Medicine has completed an evaluation of adverse events reported in dogs of various ages treated with Librela, a monoclonal antibody drug used to control pain associated with osteoarthritis in dogs. The adverse events identified and analyzed include neurologic signs such as seizures, weakened muscles (paresis), urinary incontinence, increased thirst and increased urination. In some cases, symptoms resulted in death or euthanasia of the dog.

The FDA approved Librela in May 2023, and American pharmaceutical company Zoetis introduced it to the market later that year. The agency has posted its adverse drug event report at https://tinyurl.com/33jk7h4n. Veterinarians can report adverse events with Librela to Zoetis or directly to FDA at www.fda. gov/reportanimalae.

FDA's role in drug safety

The FDA monitors the safety profile of all animal drugs after they reach the market, as widespread use of a drug in a large number of patients may uncover adverse events not observed prior to approval. Pharmaceutical companies (drug sponsors) are required to report all cases of adverse events they receive from the public, including pet owners and veterinarians, to the FDA. The agency evaluates adverse events and other safety information when it becomes available. When appropriate, FDA works with the drug sponsor to address any concerns. FDA may request updates to drug labeling, post-approval studies, or require additional or more frequent reporting. The FDA Center for Veterinary Medicine does not currently have the authority to mandate safety-related labeling changes.

Since 1999 Matt has been showing his dogs in competitive dog sports (Flyball, Agility, Herding and Rally) as well as doing in-home behavioral lessons.
