## **Building 1 Scent Odor Use Reminders**

Please be aware that because of the long-lasting effect of essential oils, scent odors must be used in a responsible manner regardless of the location they are used. Members who are practicing scent work and using scent odors (birch/anise/clove, etc.) are reminded of the following:

- No odors or odor vessels (straws/tins/other) can be placed on any QC Obedience, Rally or Agility equipment,
- No odors or odor vessels can be placed on any white or green ring gates or blue ring stanchions,
- No odors or odor vessels can be placed in between the rubber floor mats anywhere,
- The agility building is 100% off limits to any scent odor use.

When placing odors anywhere else in or outside the building, please think about others who train or show and how they would feel if their dog encountered scent odor that was poorly managed. Also, those who practice SW at the Club outside of a class must not use items (containers/toys, etc.) that are used in QC's SW classes.

SW instructors, assistants and general members must be responsible and account for all odors and odor containers they place or store during a class or practice. This ensures that no hides or items containing odors are left by accident in any area of Building 1. Please properly deodorize all locations where odors were stored and used with 50/50 Vinegar+ water, Zero Odor Pro or 99% alcohol even if the odor is inside a scent vessel.

These reminders are to help ensure the Club's buildings and surrounding property are free from all scent odors. An odor that is left somewhere in the building that is not properly removed and deodorized can cause a major issue for not only for QC's students, and for an exhibitor coming to any of our AKC Obedience, Rally, Agility or Scent Work trials. We appreciate your help and cooperation for those who train and trial at the Club.

Whether it was your first trial, your dog's first trial or you are an experienced handler, club members earned numerous new titles and made new acquaintances. We also had some members' dogs earn High In Trial awards over the 2-day trial weekend. Congratulations again to all on your scent work accomplishments!

# The Healthy Dog Importation Act is back

Once again, federal lawmakers will consider the Healthy Dog Importation Act, a law that would govern the import of dogs for resale or adoption. After failing to get a vote in 2020 and 2024, the bill is back for consideration in this session of Congress.

Two decades ago, the National Animal Interest Alliance highlighted the practice of importing dogs to the US by rescue organizations and commercial kennels with little or no screening for disease or parasites before they entered the country. AKC and the American Veterinary Medical Association came on board as reports acknowledged that more than a million dogs per year entered this country through commercial and retail rescue outlets with little or no oversight.

Over the years, this lack of screening of dog health and failure to detect fraudulent rabies vaccination certificates resulted in importation of rabies-infected dogs; reintroduction of screwworm, a deadly zoonotic pest considered eradicated in the US in the mid-1960s; cases of brucellosis, a zoonotic disease; outbreaks of canine flu and distemper; and introduction of exotic ticks and other pests.

In 2019, AKC, NAIA, and AVMA worked on language to help assure that dogs intended for resale or adoption are healthy when they enter the country, and three veterinarians serving in Congress joined Senator Chuck Grassley of Iowa introduced the bill. Although it had no action as stand-alone legislation in 1920 or 1923, some of its provisions were added to the 2024 Farm Bill.

If passed, the *Healthy Dog Importation Act* would require every imported dog to have a certificate of veterinary inspection from a licensed veterinarian with some exemptions for personal pet travel and military dogs. The health certificate must attest the dog has received all required vaccinations and demonstrated negative test results.

The legislation also would create an online database containing documentation and import permits to ensure dogs entering the country are being properly screened. This would allow further cooperation and communication between USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and US Customs and Border Protection.

# Ohio law gives guidelines for saving pets in locked vehicles

Summer temperatures bring stories of suffering in the extreme heat that can build up in closed vehicles. Exhibitors at dog shows and trials are particularly aware of the potential for problems because of the amount of time dogs can spend in cars, motor homes, and vans.

Ohio law exempts those who forcibly enter a vehicle to save a suffering pet from civil liability if the rescuer

- Determines that the vehicle is locked or there is otherwise no reasonable method for the animal to get out.
- Has a good faith and reasonable belief that forcible entry into the vehicle is necessary because the animal is in imminent danger of suffering harm if not immediately removed from the vehicle;
- Makes a good faith effort to contact local emergency responders before forcibly entering the vehicle. If prior contact is not possible, the person shall make contact as soon as possible after entry.
- Makes a good faith effort to notify the vehicle owner with a note on the windshield giving contact information, the reason for the entry, the location of the animal, and the fact that the authorities have been notified.
- \* Remains with the animal in a safe location until law enforcement or emergency responders arrive.
- Uses only the forced entry necessary to remove the animal. Excessive damage to the vehicle opens the person to civil liability.

# Legislative report

# Local lawmaker introduces stronger dangerous dog law

Ohio Senator Louis Blessing of Hamilton County wants a stricter dangerous dog law to hold owners more accountable for the bad actions of their dogs.

In 2014, Ohio lawmakers said goodbye to breed-specific laws targeting the breed type identified as a "pit bull" or "pit bull mix" and replaced it with amendments focused on dog behavior rather than dog breed profile or history. However, these amendments failed to drive down the number of serious dog bite incidents in the state.

In 2023, Ohio was third in the number of postal worker dog bites according to the US Postal Service. That year 359 carriers were bitten, up from 311 in 2022. Cleveland, Cincinnati, and Columbus are in the top 20 nationwide for USPO worker bites.

This year, the USA Today Ohio Bureau looked at the state's dangerous dog laws and published the results in several of it's Ohio newspapers, including the *Cincinnati Enquirer* and the *Dayton Daily News*. The outcome is a new emphasis on these laws. Senator Blessing's bill would amend current law to hold dog owners more accountable for their dog's actions and increase penalties for recklessly or negligently allowing the dog to commit such actions. Among other provisions, SB 185

- ★ tightens the definitions of nuisance, dangerous, and vicious dogs;
- ★ allows courts to require euthanizing dogs that kill or seriously harm a person;

- ★ raises the standard for investigating whether a dog's behavior qualifies as nuisance, dangerous, or vicious behavior from "reasonable cause" to the stiffer "probable cause";
- ★ maintains the difference between provoked and unprovoked attacks;
- ★ allows courts to order obedience training for dogs that fall are judged to fit these categories;
- ★ requires tighter confinement for dangerous and vicious dogs, including construction of "fencing that is sufficiently constructed to prevent escape";
- ★ increases penalties for violations to include felonies in cases of owner negligence or recklessness; and
- ★ holds dog wardens accountable for doing their jobs.

AKC's Government Relations Department is in touch with lawmakers regarding the new emphasis on amending this law. SB 185 is at <u>https://tinyurl.com/yc7d5dxz</u>. Senator Blessing presented sponsor testimony to the Senate Judiciary Committee on May 7.

# Another Ohio bill

**Senate Bill 60** would expand the definition of a veterinary-client-patient relationship to allow an Ohio-licensed veterinarian to treat an animal by seeing it through electronic means instead of a hands-on examination. The bill includes provisions that require the veterinarian to have client consent, prohibit the veterinarian from prescribing a controlled substance without a hands-on examination of the animal, and to reserve the right to require a hands-on exam if he believes it is warranted.

A similar bill died at the end of the last legislative session. Sponsors are Senator Steve Huffman of Troy and Senator Shane Wilkin of Highland County. Both senators testified in the February 25 hearing of the Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee.
